What kinds of services are expose in this site?

Let's start with Nurses:

Pediatric Nurses,
Register nurses,
Licensed Practical
Nurses :

A **Licensed Nurse**, Will offer her services for premature babies, special babies, multiples preemies, babies who need oxygen or babies with a special care. Usually it's a option that will come from your Pediatrician when babies are discharge from the **N.I.C.U.**

Note: Always Ask for the License of Your Potential Caregiver Plus Highly Recommendations or References.

Baby Nurses:

A **Baby Nurse or Newborn Specialist** is a **non medical trainee, who has lots of experience** with newborns. They will come into your home, providing the physical and emotional support in the transition of pregnancy and motherhood. ALL **baby nurses** are experts with multiples, preemies, feeding and sleeping schedule, recognizing symptoms and much more.

When hiring a **baby nurse** ask for a least 5 references, CPR certificate, and pictures of them with babies, liability insurance (if possible) and background check (if possible).

DOULA:

The word "**doula**" comes from the ancient Greek meaning "a **woman who serves**" and is now used to refer to a trained and experienced professional who provides continuous physical, emotional and informational support to the mother before, during and just after birth.

Nanny:

A **Nanny** is an individual that provides a service for a family, which is caring for a child/ or children in the parents absence. They provide live in or live out services. When hiring a nanny make sure you review **References, CPR certificate, Pictures of them with babies, Liability Insurance {if possible} and background checks**. During the Interview set 2 appointments: One to meet Her/him to make sure there is a click or you like them.

The other one is to interact with the children's under her/his care and ask questions like what will be a regular day with my children's when I am absent?

Lactation Consultants:

Certified breast feeding experts, who will provide new mothers with confident, support and tips teaching you how to breastfeed your baby (ies). and much more.

AU PAIR:

An **au pair** (plural: **au pairs**) is a domestic assistant from a foreign country working for, and living as part of, a host **family**. Typically, au pairs take on a share of the family's responsibility for **childcare** as well as some **housework**, and receive a small monetary **allowance** for personal use.

Special Care:

Special Needs Care is a trained service provider, who will care for babies or children's with learning disabilities and/or special needs.

Baby planners & Baby coordinators:

Whether you are having your baby, adopting, or using a surrogate, **Baby Planners/Coordinators** will help you Preparing, Organizing, Planning and choosing the right products in the large baby marketplace. They specialize in assisting Expecting Parents in preparing for baby (ies) arrival: Shopping, Nursery Décor, Baby Registry and much more. It's like a Wedding Planner, but these experts will assist and support you to don't be overwhelmed with the babies' arrival.

Wellness Mommies:

Acupuncture, Massage or Yoga for Pregnant and Post-Partum Moms these are Services that connect you with your body and soul. For acupuncture and massage services make sure they are certified.

Mohels:

A **Mohel** is an expert in the surgical aspects of circumcision as well as knowledgeable in the laws and customs pertaining to a traditional circumcision and ceremony. A **mohel** is a person who is certified to be capable and knowledgeable in both the surgical aspects of performing circumcision as well as the traditional aspects of performing a kosher circumcision and the traditional ceremony.

Child Care Center:

Child care (or "**childcare**" or "**baby care**" or "**daycare**") means caring for and supervising child/children usually from 0–8 years of age. In the United States child care is increasingly referred to as early childhood education due to the understanding of the impact of early experiences of the developing child. **Child care** is a broad topic covering a wide spectrum of contexts, activities, social and cultural conventions, and institutions. The majority of child care institutions that are available require that **child care providers** have extensive training in first aid and are CPR certified. In addition, background checks, drug testing, and reference verification are normally a requirement.

Baby Photographers:

They are certified/professional photographers specializing in artistic [photography](#) of pregnancy, maternity, newborns, babies, and children.

Child Proofing your Home:

The average home is not designed, constructed or furnished with the safety needs of a child in mind. Sadly, many parents are unaware of the potential dangers in their home until an injury occurs. An [experienced child proofer](#) can provide valuable peace of mind for parents, grandparents and caregivers by identifying safety hazards in and around the home, recommending specific safety solutions and providing professional installation services.

Birthing Centers:

A birthing center or centre is a healthcare facility, staffed by [Nurse-midwives, midwives](#) and/or [obstetricians](#), for mothers in [labor](#), who may be assisted by [doulas](#) and coaches. By attending the laboring mother, the doulas can assist the midwives and make the birth easier. The midwives monitor the labor and well-being of the mother and baby/ies, during birth. Should additional medical assistance be required the mother can be transferred to a hospital. Some hospitals are now adding [birth centers](#) to their facilities as an alternative to the high tech maternity wards commonly found at most hospitals.

A birth center presents a more home-like environment than a [hospital labor ward](#), typically with more options during labor: food/drink, music, and the attendance of family and friends if desired. Other characteristics can also include non-institutional furniture such as queen-sized beds, large enough for both mother and father and perhaps birthing tubs or showers for [water births](#).



Adoption Centers:

Certified centers in charge of adoptions. **Adoption** is a process whereby a person assumes the **parenting** for another and, in so doing, permanently transfers all **rights** and responsibilities from the original parent or parents.




Infertility Clinics:

Certified Centers of Reproductive Endocrinologists and Infertility specialists in reproductive science and are some of the most accomplished and respected doctors in the infertility field.



Surrogate Services:

Surrogacy is an arrangement in which a woman carries and delivers a child for another couple or person. This woman may be the child's genetic mother (called **traditional surrogacy**), or she may carry the pregnancy to delivery after having an embryo, to which she has no genetic relationship, transferred to her uterus (called **gestational surrogacy**). If the pregnant woman received compensation for carrying and delivering the child (besides medical and other reasonable expenses) the arrangement is called a **commercial surrogacy**, otherwise the arrangement is sometimes referred to as an **altruistic surrogacy**.



Frequent questions ask by Professionals or Caregivers

1. How can this website help me expose my services to pregnant woman and new mothers?

2. Can I register for Free?

A: Yes, we offer free registration.

3. Can I try the service first without paying?

A: Yes. In fact, we encourage you to do so. A free membership allows you to explore our most popular features, including Today's Matches and My Top Picks, and to see real nanny resumes and jobs in our database. Once you have found a nanny/family that you would like to contact, you can upgrade to a paid membership easily.

4. How long will it take to complete the subscription process?

A: We estimate that it will take approximately 20 minutes.

5. Why do I need to answer so many questions?

A: Keep in mind that the more time you spend with your account, the better your chances are for finding the perfect candidate or job. [Professionals](#) or [Caregivers](#) are using the site to search for jobs the same way that families are using it to search for their services. If you are very descriptive about what you want, then you will attract appropriate families.

6. I've lost my password. How can I find it?

A: Go to the home page. In the space where you normally provide your User Name and Password, there is a link that says "[Need Help?](#)" Clicking on that will take you to a form where you can enter your e-mail address. We will then e-mail you your [User Name](#) and [Password](#).

7. How do I log out?

A: When you have a membership and are logged in to the site, you will see a "[Log Out](#)" button on the upper right corner of every page. Click it at any time to log out of the system.

8. How do I upload a photo?

A: Log in to the site and go to the My Account page. There you will see a link on the left called "[Upload My Photo](#)." Click on that and then follow the instructions. The photo must be JPG format and less than 300MB in size. This needs new updated wording since there is no size limit now and we accept another file format also. Please rewrite as necessary.

9. Why should I get a paid membership when you offer a free membership?

A: The free family membership is designed to let you try out [AngelsforBabies.Org](https://angelsforbabies.org) Source first, so that you can explore our most popular features and see actual professionals caregivers resumes. However, it is limited in that you cannot see contact information for any candidates with a free membership (which makes up the majority of professionals using our site) cannot see your contact information. You must purchase a Gold or Platinum membership if you plan to actually hire a candidate using our service.

10. Why can't I see contact information for some of the families I find?

A: We allow families to sign up for a free membership to test our service before making a purchase. The free membership allows them to perform searches and see information about you, but your contact information is not visible to each other. Only paid memberships allow families to display and see contact information.

You can still add a family with a free membership to your Top Picks list or even send the family an e-mail from their profile, and they will be notified by e-mail. Frequently these families eventually become paid members, especially when they know there is a nanny who is interested in them.

11. What about security?

A: AngelsforBabies.org will like to let you know that security is **OUR MAIN PRIORITY**. Here are some hints:

- #1) your personal data when you register on our website **will not** be share to a third party.
- #2) Security Tip: The First appointment with a Parent could be in a public place. Inform to your Family Members or Friends where you are going, providing the name and address of your contact. Set your **GPS** or Locator on your **CELLPHONE**.
- #3) Use your common sense. As a Professional you need to be on time on your interview. If you have an interview for a Baby Nurse,

Nanny or similar positions listed on AngelsforBabies.Org, you should NOT be interview just by the **DAD**. Usually is the Mother, the Grandmother, The Personal Assistant or Both Parents. If you are feeling uncomfortable in anyway, **GET AWAY FROM THERE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE!!!...**

#4) If the Person that's hires you, is not treating you with **RESPECT**, you feel offended by the words **He or She** uses or if you feel **He or She** are is letting you down, Leave that JOB.
